Holy Week: Walk to the 100 Steps

We will be celebrating Holy Week on Thursday 29th March with our traditional walk up to the 100 steps. Meet at Sails Area at 9:15am where we will focus on the importance of Lent. From there we will journey up to the 100 steps where we will re-enact the events of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Resurrection. **Parents, grandparents or members of the parish are welcome to join us on our walk**. We would like everyone to participate in our celebration of Holy Week by dressing up in a costume from the time of Jesus. All children can wear their sports uniform and come to school with their costume over their sports uniform. **Students are required to bring a towel to sit on (pop this inside a plastic shopping bag), their water bottles, their hats and it is recommended that everyone apply sunscreen in the morning. You might also like to apply insect repellent to your child.**

We will be distributing bread to everyone during the Holy Thursday part of the re-enactments. If you or your child has an **allergy** to bread, you may like to bring your own so that you can still participate in this part.

We will mark areas where the events will take place with cones and we ask that parents take care to avoid sitting in this areas and make sure that the view of the children is not blocked.

When we return to school the children will have their hot cross bun if they have ordered one. If the weather turns nasty or wet we will move our celebration to the hall.

Mass for St Patrick's Day

On Friday 16 March a group of Year 6 students travelled with Suzanne Gracias and Mr Gibbons to celebrate the annual Mass for Schoolchildren. Held in Melbourne's St Patrick's Cathedral on the eve of the Irish saint's feast day, the cathedral was bursting with students from a multitude of primary and secondary schools, as well as family members and teachers.



Commbank School Banking

School banking day is every TUESDAY. Any new students to the program will receive your student number with your first deposit at school. The process for school banking is as follows: Students bring in their deposit books with their money on a Tuesday morning, give them to their classroom teacher, where it is then sent to the office in the note tub to be banked. Students receive a Dollarmites token each time they bank. Once they have 10 tokens, they can then send them in with their next deposit to redeem the tokens for a reward.

When redeeming your reward, make sure you only choose from the Term 1 rewards at this stage.
